The training is conducted in Perth to allow people to gain basic ground awareness skills before arriving onsite without interfering with production. Who should attend:

Everyone who works in or around an open pit mine, including: geologists, samplers, geotechnical and hydrogeological personnel, machine operators, supervisors, safety representatives, surveyors, drill and blast, maintenance, site-based administration and support staff.

It includes all personnel who visit the pit, waste dumps or stockpiles.

Content and Assessment:

The training course covers geotechnical hazard recognition, fall of ground, waste dumps and stockpiles, drop-offs, voids, scaling, rock support and reinforcement principles.

Attendees will be assessed for competence and awarded a certificate on completion of the course. Topics can be adapted to meet individual site requirements.

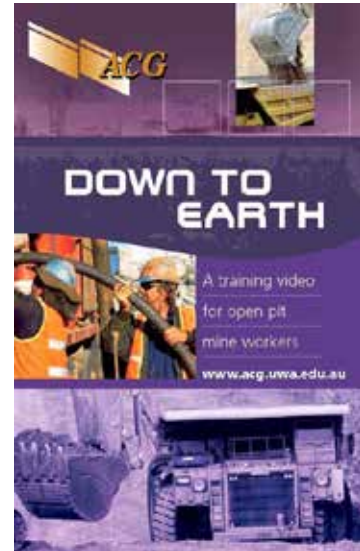
